

I suppose you are wondering why I do not write. I keep putting off, and then I am always so busy, I do not have time to make my own clothes. I am no more an assistant cook, because there is an all day assistant cook. She is from town, but I assist the matron in her work. I went to Wymans last Saturday and stayed overnight.

Find enclosed five dollars and give  
you can keep three dollars and give  
you \$3.00. That is my Christmas  
Julia \$2.00. That is my Christmas  
present to you. Tell Julia I did not know  
what to buy for her, so I give her the  
money & buy some thing for her self &  
you the same. This is all for this  
time. Good bye. Wishing you all  
a Merry Christmas & Happy New Year  
from Glorie.

berries when I was coming  
away. She said some Sunday  
when the sleighing is good  
we would go to Phil's place.  
We have quite a bit of snow  
here. I have had three cutter  
rides. I do not feel well  
most of the time. I have  
such a cold, I can't hardly  
speak some times.

home. Susan Hall Wesley
