often finds a position for their graduates
(we are hoping Grace will graduate)
she gives her graduating recital in
Toronto, Monday May 9th, she comes
home on the 23rd and remains one
week then she goes to Toronto to rehearse
with the orchestra, and returns to Altona
April 4. Harold remains until she goes
to Toronto in May. Her diploma (if she
gets it) will cost \$15.00. besides all the
rest of it. No, I do not expect to go with
her although I would just love to.

We have to be so careful of our money
that I do not feel that I can afford it.
It will seem too bad to have none up
here. If she should sail she will try
again in the fall. I sometimes think I will
make some change next September. I may
sell or rent, and Hawld and I will
go to Detroit, and the girls will remain
here. I do not want to take Helen out of
this "Collegiate" until she finishes, she
will try for her part-I of her 1st-class
certificate ^{in June} then part-II next year or
final. I cannot tell yet for sure
I will know better as the time comes
^{what I will do}. I must now close, hoping to
hear from you soon. and that you
are improving and that Aggie is
keeping well. I have not heard from
C. T. for a long time. have you?
