We have just this day received some more news of your troubles, by Atangapre, and in consideration we are very sorry indeed, yes we feel for you.

We have this day held a council in this place, for the purpose of consulting among all of us, well after explaining all your situation, where you now stand, we have made a unanimous will that you had better make away with all you claim there and come and live here with us,

We all hope sure that the Great Spirit will help us along, and all that are here present beg and pray that you will not refuse our call for you to come and live here with us, we do not speak for you alone, but we mean the whole of your band. Come, and help us here, that we may by your assistance conduct affairs which will be best both for us + our children
