My dear friend

Ma. we nauth

Sir, when you came to see us  
at our Camp meeting - you very  
friendly invited us to go and  
reside on <sup>your</sup> tract of Land and among  
your people - and that the Superintend-  
-ent Mr. Jones would build me a  
House to live in which we think  
was very kind - but at present my  
people think that I had better stay  
with them - and I have therefore  
given up the idea of going -

You will please at the same time state  
to Mr. Superintendent Jones for his inform-  
-ation that George M. John and 8 or 10  
others that have been in the habit  
of drawing presents at the S. Blair  
now reside at this place and will  
in future draw their presents at  
Colborne on Thames - Your friend
