

Indian Department Toronto C.W.

Sir

February 3. 1838. [1858]

Stand before me the questions put to you by David
Wawanash in relation to his position supposing that he
will to avail himself of the Act of last Session. I would
therefore direct you to state,

- 1st That he will be entitled to the Capital of
his share of the Community due to his tribe, and of the
yearly interest arising from the lands sales.
- 2^d That he will be entitled to receive the additional
annual payment of \$300 secured to him by the
provincial Agreement at the time of the late
surrender.
- 3rd It does not occur just to the tribe at large that
one individual should have the exclusive right
to a portion of their community property to which
the advance of settlement has given an extra
value as compared with the rest of
their Reserve.

You are therefore empowered to offer him the option
either of remaining where he is or of removing to
another portion of the tract. Should he choose
the former alternative, he must be restricted to
such a quantity as will not exceed in value
the lot which he would receive elsewhere.

If he should decide to take advantage of the
Act, he may be allowed the full quantity of
land, 50 acres, granted by the law provided he
agrees to move out to the lower part of the Reserve
on the other hand, if he elects to continue as now
a member of the tribe, he can only receive such
an extent of land as the Commissioners shall
decide upon for each head of a family.
It may ^{not} be amiss to point out to him that as
under the Act he cannot neither sell or lease

his land he could derive but little advantage
from the lot he now occupies, while he might
be liable to increased taxation if it falls
within the City limits.

If he remove from his present location
he would of course be entitled to receive the
value of his improvements.
