Monroe Town Dec. 19<sup>th</sup> 1842

My dear Brother,

Brother John Dumas has informed me that a Mr. M. Dougal living at Fort Gratot on the American side, has a book containing some of the old agreements and treaties made by the British Government and our Indian Sovereigns. Mr. Dumas says you had better take the book, and that Mr. M. Dougal was so kind as to lend it to you at one time.

Brother, will you have the goodness to borrow it from Mr. M. Dougal for a few weeks, and I will thank you to send it to me by the first opportunity. I am very anxious to see what it contains, and as I am corresponding with the Government at Kingston, it may afford me with materials by which I may be enabled to advocate the interests of our Indian Sibs.

I hope you are all well.

I am doing to say that my health is not very good. My family are all well.

Give my Christian love to all the brothers and sisters. My kindest regards here love to your wife.
