could go back again but I am sure
you will. I have not got the other
letter off but will send the both.
I have just made arrangements
with a widower M. Mitchel to bake
his bread. & Dora I can get lots of

sewing & we could do well, & live out-
here I know. Dear Affie I will save the
papers ^{at home} & send - for D. for me for
the year, so he did not go until 22.
from there but is there now if all is
well, & will be back in March.
