My dear Sir

I have just now received your letter of the 12<sup>th</sup> Inst. and regret my mistake in regard to the Cheque for the Moravians which as you suggest was erroneously based on the Balance for 1834 instead 1835. I will therefore feel obliged if you will return it in order that the sum may be refunded and a corrected one may issue in its stead.

With regard to the Samia & Halfide Account I find all right & as I intended it you will perceive that the balance on the 31<sup>st</sup> March was £757<sup>10</sup> 18<sup>11</sup> 4 from that date to the 4<sup>th</sup> July 5 warrants have issued, amounting to

leaving the above balance of £451-17-1 against which you have the Cheque for £450. Being within £1-17-1 of the full amount. I have submitted your letter to the Supt. General who desires me to say that the Indians cannot expect to draw their Annuities twice viz first in detail and then again in bulk and he deems it inexpedient to intercept the next years Annuity by drawing in advance. If however you recommend their Requestion for a further sum at the end of the half year i.e. 30<sup>th</sup> Sept next he will recommend it payable.
