My Dear Brother

As William is leaving for Sarnia, according to your request, I drop a line by him to say: The children are all well. During the Winter no attempts were made by any to run away; but since the Spring commenced I am sorry to say that "Eliza Kind" attempted it and took two others with her. We prevented them. She was by her consent placed in the School for two years: and it will be very displeasing to the Governor General to hear of her, or any other, running away. I am required, by him, to report all such cases - I hope you and the Chiefs will express your dissatisfaction at any such attempts, and if the parents would join with you and say to them in a letter to me, that if they came home they would be in some way punished, and sent back, it would do good - We are doing all we can to improve them and to make them happy.
