

Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> March 1891-

H. Mrs J. Sands,

An Indian woman got off from the Steamer Mary at Algona on the 26<sup>th</sup> of Feb'y - She started to cross on the ice to go to Walpole Island. Some person at the Town of Algona told her not to cross on the ice that evening as the ice was breaking up. I was afraid she did not heed this warning but started and crossed the American Channel all right as she was seen on the Island in the River St Clair it was getting dark there, there was a well beaten gray trail on the ice from this

this Island to the main  
Island (Walpole) but  
this road was abandoned  
on account of the ice  
breaking. it was partly  
open just where the  
Sleigh track was and  
full of air holes, as  
it was getting very dark  
then poor Elizabeth  
must have followed  
this track and on  
account of being dark  
could not see the open  
places or air holes on  
the ice she must have  
walked right into them  
She called for help  
when the accident

Happened by quite a  
number of the Walpole  
Island Indians. She  
made a faint noise &  
in a very short time it  
was all over, no one  
dared to go to the place  
they know the place  
where it happen -

I went every place  
on the Island where  
I thought that she might  
Stay but no person  
saw her excepting  
the whites at Algonac  
when I could not find  
her on the Island I  
lost all hope of finding

And have made up my  
mind it was her that  
that was heard shouting  
for help. She is gone!  
Gone!! forever from us,  
Never to return to us again  
I feel the loss more keenly  
than any of my people  
that have died, we were  
the only two left in our  
family, now I am alone.  
This is indeed a terrible  
Affair but we are in  
the hands of a Releover God  
who rule all things and who  
never makes an error but  
does all things right -  
Dear Neile. Keep up courage  
and let us serve God and all things  
will turn out right. Yours affec
