My Dear Sir

Sir I now take this opportunity to write a few lines to you, in regard to your inquiry about Peitannukkwut, they were ^{two} ^{hear} ~~both~~ Ottawa's. The first one, was part French, rather tall with a roman nose, which I think is the man you are inquiring about. I found by inquiring among the Ottawa's that the above Peitannukkwut, has or had a brother in that country somewhere, by the name of Peemashe, also a sister. The above Peitannukkwut, has no children living at present nor no near relatives, in this country. He died about eight years ago. The other Peitannukkwut, was a full blooded Indian, rather small in stature, dark complected. no relatives in your country as I could hear. This Peitannukkwut has a daughter living. That is all that I can find out about Peitannukkwut. We are at present well and doing well our fields looks nice our corn is from two to three feet high. all quiet here in Kansas, the Indians is going to have a grand council, fifteen different tribes together down among the Cherokees, when the council come off I will tell you the results that is all. take care of yourself
