

Pentanguishim 16<sup>th</sup> March 1842

Dear Brother

you will take these few lines as a Brother very much in distress as poor as a man can be, according to your promise I have got my self in debt for provisions this is the reason I call upon you once more I hope I will not be disappointed this time I hope you will do all in your power to relieve me and get me out of the merchants books so I depend upon you as soon as possible for without your assistance I shall be very pitiful this is all I have to say at present I hope your answer soon

you - be so good as to tell Wapishon that is Daughter is well and sends her love to her father she wishes me to mention to her Father ~~if~~ that she has been ast in marriage by a fine young man a Canadian a sober young man doing well if he has no objection I shall wait for his permission and she wishes her Father to send her something

N.B. John Assaner is waiting for you to know what you can do for me according to what you will do he says will do the same
