no satisfaction whatever I was
constantly entertained with the ex-
isting difficulties amongst the me-
thodists, and upon endeavouring to
turn the train of the discours, sud-
denly they launched out into an
ocean of troubles experienced years
before occasioned by the disunion
in Ireland. I next endeavoured
to turn the tide by mentioning
the blessings which we enjoyed in
this peaceful country and the
gratitude which should flow from
our hearts on this account, and
was about to apply the subject
when I was interrupted by a long
story of the rebellion in Ireland
this occupied so much time
that at the close prudence
admonished us to retire to rest.
Musing on the best way of making
a successful attack in the morning
I fell asleep.

The morning refreshed I arose
whilst breakfast was pre-

paring, I made my last but un-
successful onset in the open and
plain old methodist fashion. I
put the question, Sir did you ever
experience a change of heart
I waited the result - when after
a short suspense, the unappro-
priate remark following was made
The preachers here do not pray as
they did at home. I endeavoured to
avoid discussing the subject, and
enquired again - are you endeav-
ouring to serve God. he replied
The methodists here never repeat
the Lords prayer and his wife
gave us (to me) a tedious and
~~lengthy~~ long discourse on the vast
importance of closing every pray-
er with the Lords prayer.

I opened my sinner broadside upon
them, wounded them sore, and pointing
them to the physicians of souls
I took my leave.

Sunday Proceeding to my next
appointment I stopped a few
minutes in a store attended
as clerk by one of our people
and there found an old grey
headed sinner not only deluged
in sin but his reason drown-
ed in accursed whiskey.
God made man upright but
he hath sought out many
inventions and of all the
mischief which has ever
been devised his mischievous
brain now is in my opinion
more diabolical than the dis-
tilling of ardent spirits. —

Spoke to a numerous company
at Widow Edwards seriously atten-
tive my soul was raised and
blest in adverting them.

The widow and a daughter
appears to be determined to
flee from the wrath to come

and I trust they will soon be
emancipated from the thral-
dom of Satan. The little boy
about 13 or 14 wept whilst I
conversed with him and when
I left them we wept together
my soul was happy to weep
with those that weep and
I humbly trust to rejoice
with them in heaven if I or
we are permitted on earth.
Wednesday called to visit this morn-
ing on my way to my evening
duty met with the old forlorn
man whom I saw at the store
yesterday dealt plainly with him
he appears hardened in sin
and whilst I conversed I feared
that his damnation was
sealed, his wife is an Israel-
ite indeed nearly thirty years
an acceptable member in

our society my soul was encou-
raged whilst in her company
she conversed freely and her
conversation was all of Jesus
my soul ate her words and
derived strength therefrom.
I found father Sings to be a
methodist of the old stamp
and a staunch adherer to
the old rules and people
his kindness and childlike
simplicity I shall long
remember as also his partner
then a man gave me a lec-
ture for not being punctual
to time in the last appoint-
ment, but on finding his mis-
take of scolding me instead
of B: M: M he begged pardon
I obtained a promise from
him that he would repeat
his remarks no more so I
saved my brothers feelings

and it did not injure mine
oh how ready the world are
to say "pay me that thou owest"
Thursday. met the children at
B: Sings School H: - heard about
twenty turn write their state
children spoke with ~~the~~ pray-
ed with them and proceeded on
my way to my next appoint-
ment Evening spoke to a crowded com-
pany at B: H: - I felt my mind
burthened I did not feel sufficiently
by the worth of souls I could not
rise but crept grovelling on ^{my} knees
altho my text said "set your affections
on things above &c" but perhaps
(if I burst) while I was half down
I chorah spoke - The class in this
place is immovable, trusting in
God rejoicing in Union & the
bands of peace - may the Good
Shepherd watch over them for good

Friday Called this morning at
B^r G — 's conversed on the things
of God we rejoiced together
prayed & parted in peace —
Evening Spoke at B^r R —
my soul was blessed and I
trust the word proved a sa-
vour of life unto life, —

After which I went to the
Mission —

Saturday Set out for Cavan
and arrived safely after travel-
ling through the woods sever-
al miles on foot neither
road, line, sun, moon, or
stars but Jehovah conduct-
ed me safely in his mercy

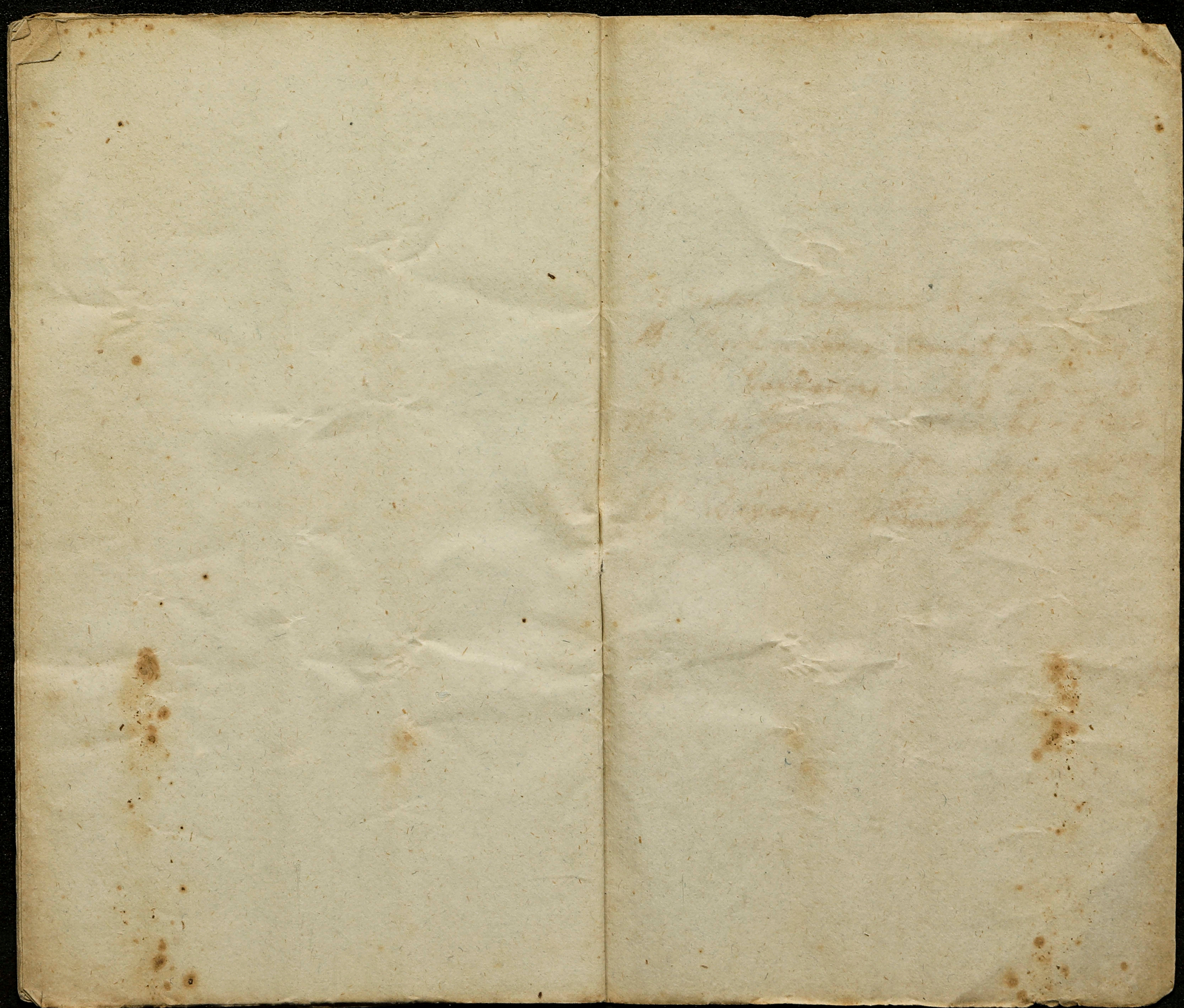
Sunday Spoke at B^r D
